Kissing Bugs In Kentucky

Have no fear your local entomologist is here to put your mind at ease when it comes to all of the kissing bug stories in the news. Kissing bugs have been a hot topic lately, due to their ability to spread Chagas disease.


However, our local kissing bug, the Eastern Bloodsucking Conenose (such a friendly name) operates differently than its cousin that spreads Chagas.

Kissing bugs that do spread Chagas will bite near the face (thus the name) then immediately defecate after feeding. Fecal matter is then accidentally wiped into the wound transferring the pathogen. Our kissing bug can carry the Chagas pathogen, but being a much more polite insect does not defecate directly after feeding. This greatly reduces their ability to vector the disease. There are many look -a-likes out there, if you think you have found a kissing bug we are happy to ID it for you. However, the University of Kentucky Entomology Department is not offering testing for Chagas if samples are submitted to campus.

Fast Facts

- KY has a local "kissing bug" called the **eastern bloodsucking conenose** (pictured above)
- This insect is **not good** at transmitting the parasites that cause Chagas disease
- There is **low risk** for contracting Chagas in KY

Grilled Sweet Potatoes

6 medium sweet potatoes	Dressing: 3 tablespoons olive oil	1/2 teaspoon lemon zest
3 tablespoons olive oil	1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh basil	1 tablespoon lemon juice
	1/4 teaspoon salt	

Prepare grill for hot, direct heat. Peel sweet potatoes and cut lengthwise or on a diagonal into 1/2-inch slices. Coat each slice with olive oil. Lay sweet potato slices on hot grill. Cook about 5 minutes on each side until slices are tender and crisp, being careful not to char. Baste sweet potato slices with dressing and serve hot.

Fall Spiced Pumpkin Bread

1/2 cup all-purpose flour	2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice	1/2 cup honey
1 1/4 cup whole-wheat flour	1/2 teaspoon salt	2 cups pumpkin puree
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder	1/2 cup melted margarine	1/2 cup olive oil
1 teaspoon baking soda	1/2 cup sugar	2 eggs

Heat oven to 350 degrees F. Mix flours, baking powder, baking soda, pumpkin pie spice and salt; set aside. In a large mixing bowl, whisk together margarine, sugar, honey, pumpkin puree and eggs. Add flour mixture. Stir until dry ingredients are moistened. Spray a 8-by-4 inch loaf pan with non-stick cooking spray. Pour batter into pan; sprinkle walnuts on top of batter. Bake for 1 hour. Remove from oven and cover with foil. Return to oven and bake an additional 20 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes and remove from pan.

Nutritional Analysis: 200 calories, 9 g fat, 1.5 g saturated fat, 0 mg cholesterol, 170 mg sodium, 26 g carbohydrate, 4 g fiber, 5 g sugars, 2 g protein.

Yield: 6 servings.

Heath Aster

This fall I've talked with several people about a plant with little white flowers that are covered in honey bees and other native bees. When coming home from work one evening I discovered this plant was scattered all over one of our pastures. After I did a little investigating, I discovered it was an aster, commonly called Heath Aster or White Aster.



In a pasture and lawn setting, these asters are considered weeds. However, when I approached these plants on a warm fall day all I could hear was buzzing. Covering this plant's tiny white flowers were many different insects happily working the flowers. These asters provide an important source of nectar for honey bees, bumble bees, flies, solitary bees, butterflies and more in the fall.



Heath Asters are perennials and native to America. They can be found growing in dry rocky areas. Once they are established they are very drought and deer tolerant. My theory as to why we have seen so many is due to our dry summer and fall. They can grow to 1-3ft tall and 1-2ft wide. These plants can make a great addition to any pollinator garden, for a fall nectar supply. If they are more of a weed issue in your landscape, we also have a few different control options to eradicate them as well.


